 este aspecto detenidamente, incluyendo la posibilidad de alterar
 los títulos de algunos cursos.

FIELD MAJOR IN SOCIAL SCIENCES

The field major in social Sciences may serve the needs of four groups of students: (1) those seeking to prepare to teach in elementary schools, high schools and junior colleges who desire a broad training in the social sciences; (2) those generally interested in social sciences but who have not yet chosen a field of specialization; (3) those who intend to do graduate work in a specific discipline but who want a broad undergraduate training and (4) those intending to enter professional schools (e.g., the School of Law or the School of Social Work) that do not require training in a special discipline but recommende broad training in the social sciences.
