

NOTE: Students who demonstrate a fundamental proficiency in English and/or Spanish by achieving a high score on the Advanced Level Placement Exam and/or the College Board Exam may be awarded credit for English 001-002 and/or Spanish 001-002. Those who demonstrate a high level achievement in Mathematics on the Advanced Level Placement Exam and/or the College Board Exam may be awarded credit for Mathematics 105-106. Those students shall begin instruction in English and/or Spanish and/or Mathematics at the 200 level.

ENGLISH DEPARTMENT REQUIREMENTS:

The English Major program requires forty-two (42) credit hours above the general language requirement of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences.

Core Courses: Twenty-one (21) of these credit hours have been designated as "core" courses (Engl 207, 232, 309, 321, 322, 351, and 352), and are required of all students in the English Department in order to guarantee that each student has a basic familiarity with English Literature, American Literature, the study of Language, and that he or she is capable of writing clear and correct English at an advanced level.

Track Courses: The remaining twenty-one (21) credit hours are to be taken, according to the student's preference, from courses designated either as Literature - Track I--- or Language -- Track II- courses. In the Literature track the student will take Engl 439 and Engl 490 as well as 6 credit hours at the 300 level and 9 credit hours at the 400 level as English Electives. In the Language track the student will take Engl 333, 401, 451, and 489 as well as 3 credit hours at the 300 level and 6 credit hours at the 400 level as English Electives.

NCTE: A student may, through judicious use of English Electives, plan a program that will combine the basic requirements of both tracks.

RECOMMENDED ELECTIVES--COURSES FROM OTHER DISCIPLINES:

In addition to the required forty-two(42) credit hours above, the student will elect twenty-four (24) credit hours from other disciplines recognized as supporting fields for the degree in English. A list of these courses- in Hispanic Studies, the Humanities, Foreign Languages, the Social Sciences, and selected Education courses from the Division of Extension -- may be obtained from the student's advisor.

NCTE: Through careful planning and selection a student may use these recommended courses to achieve teacher certification by the Department of Education of Puerto Rico.

FREE ELECTIVES:

In accordance with institutional regulations twelve (12) elective credits are entirely at the student's discretion. These free electives should not be confused either with the English Electives mentioned under English Department Requirements, or with those recommended courses selected by the student from other disciplines after consultation with, and the approval of, an assigned English Department advisor.

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
