Violence Prevention Project at University of Puerto Rico Humacao (UPRHVPP) in alliance with the Women's Health STEPS - Services Towards Empowering Survivors (PASOS in Spanish) of the University of Puerto Rico of the Medical Sciences Campus will direct an initiative to replicate key practices and policies implemented on our campus and practices implemented by PASOS with member institutions. The goals are:

- 1. To expand and strengthen victim services in cases involving domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking with the participating campuses;
- 2. To conduct trainings on violence against women issues for security officers, faculty, students and administrators; and
- 3. To ensure a coordinated community response to violence against women on all campuses.

The objectives of the proposed program are to:

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- Strengthen the coordinated community response for a safer campus on each participating campus.
- Enhance each campus to build the capacity to solve and prevent violent crimes against women across campuses in Puerto Rico. This includes the following four components:
 - Training of the campus police/security personnel of all participating campuses to 0 effectively identify and respond to these crimes and in order to increase apprehension, investigation and adjudication.
 - o Training of the medical services personnel of all participating campuses to effectively identify and respond to violence against women crimes and support more effective investigations and adjudications. This training includes screening, and management with follow-up and advocacy.
 - Training members of the campus disciplinary board in all participating campuses to effectively respond to charges of these crimes.
 - Review, adapt and disseminate policies and procedures developed by UPRH in all participating campuses to promote a more effective response to violence against women crimes.

- Implement a mandatory orientation and educational program for all incoming students in all participating campuses.
- Organize or strengthen peer educator and men's groups for preventing violence against women in all participating campuses and system-wide.
- Review and reprint educational/awareness materials and make them available to all participating campuses.

The below signatories will work in close conjunction with the proposed project partners and its staff to ensure the effective continuation of the flagship violence prevention project throughout all relevant areas of campus life and activities. We agree to adhere to mutually agreed-upon protocols responding to victims of dating violence, sexual assault, domestic violence, and stalking, who are students, staff, or faculty of all campuses. We commit to work together to ensure the success of the proposed project. Representatives of each campus and of the external partners are members of the Flagship Planning and Development Team and will work together and with the project staff in developing and implementing the project activities. Representatives for each institution discussed and agreed on the goals and objectives and all signatories imply that each member institution, including the principal institution, has reviewed and approved the proposed budget.

University of Puerto Rico at Humacao

Since 2000, UPR Humacao through its Violence Against Women Prevention Program (VAWPP-UPRH), has worked in educating the campus community on preventing domestic violence, date rape, interpersonal violence, stalking and sexual assault. Because of the earned experience and expertise the UPRH keeps addressing violence against women issues as a very serious health public issue and as a complex one. This means the recognition of the need of specialized constant training by keeping updated of current laws and best practices in the approach of the violence against women situations. Since 2007 through the Flagship Project all effective practices of the VAWPP-UPRH have been replicated in nine campuses of the UPR System, and it will continue to support and strengthen the work in all participating campuses.

- Provide at least six students each semester through the work-study program for the peer educators group.
- VAWPP-UPRH staff will coordinate the Flagship Planning and Development Team.
- Offer technical assistance to all participating campuses staff and community members.
- Support the coordination of trainings in each campus, to: Security Officers, Disciplinary Board's, Counseling Departments and Health Services Personnel and coordinate system-wide trainings/meetings.
- Support student peer-educator and men's groups and coordinate system-wide trainings/meetings.

Women's Health STEPS (PASOS, in Spanish)

PASOS began in 2002 and is hosted by the Clinical Services of the Women and Health Center, which is part of Academic Affairs Center of Excellence in Women's Health and of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology of the School of Medicine of the University of Puerto Rico Medical Sciences Campus. PASOS is a health service provider for women survivors of sexual and domestic violence. Their services are provided from a public health interdisciplinary perspective in which the law is an instrument to access and maintain wellness after experiencing an interpersonal violent event, including medical forensic examination. PASOS has serviced over 300 women survivors of sexual and domestic violence since its opening. Participants are identified through screening in the campus Medical Services and referred by District Attorney, Police, Rape Victim Support Center, Physicians, self-referrals, Puerto Rico Sate Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence and by Family Services. The services are divided into three areas, which provide and support each other with important information for an intervention that responds to victims and agency needs: clinical, educational and research. PASOS is also supported by a Social Worker and an Obstetric Gynecologist, essential in an integrated case management and interagency collaboration.

PASOS will:

- Train health services personnel in each campus on forensic medical practices that they have developed and provided for sexual assault victims.
- Participate in the Flagship Planning and Development Team

- Stimulate and promote that their members receive referrals from Campus Flagship member institutions for victim service provision, including emergency shelter.
